The Nairn and Nairnshire Community Partnership (NNCP) was established following the introduction of the Community Empowerment Act 2015. This legislation identified the five statutory Partners to work together and support this process, forming the NNCP—Local Authority, NHS, Police Scotland, Scottish Fire & Rescue Service and Highlands & Islands Enterprise. <http://www.highlandcpp.org.uk/nairn--nairnshire-community-partnership.html>

The NNCP replaces the Nairn District Partnership and its format will be used as a structure for the NNCP to cement relationships whilst working together for the benefit of Nairn and Nairnshire communities.
